IS THERE A NEED FOR ASSISTING COACHES ESPECIALLY IN SOME OF OUR SCHOOLS THAT PARTICULAR SPORTS MAY BE MORE POPULAR. SO THERE'S MORE KIDS COMING OUT OR A NEED TO ADD A J.V. FOR FRESHMAN PROGRAM AND SUPPORTING ATHLETICS AT THE HIGH SCHOOL AS WE MOVE FROM A DIFFERENT MODEL AND I HAVE A CONCERN AROUND ATHLETIC TRAINERS. MY BOYS PLAY A LOT OF HOCKEY AND THAT'S A SPORT THERE'S USUALLY AN E.M.T. ON SITE ACROSS MOST OF OUR ATHLETIC PROGRAMMING WE SHOULD HAVE TRAINERS ACCESSIBLE JUST TO BE THERE IN CASE OF INJURY BUT MAKING SURE KIDS ARE DOING THE THINGS THEY NEED TO BE SMARTER ATHLETES. INTERESTED HOW CENTRAL OFFICE

LEAVES AND ABSENCE AND WORKERS COMP ARE A TOPIC. I DID SEE A SIGNIFICANT -- IT LOOKED LIKE A SIGNIFICANT INCREASE IN FMLA THIS YEAR AND IT MAY BE JUST BEEN IN THE THIRD OUARTER AND RELATED TO COVID-19 BUT WOULD LIKE TO UNDERSTAND WHERE THE DISTRICT IS WHETHER IT'S STANDARD IMPACT OF COVID-19 AND HOW THEY'RE THINKING ABOUT AND SHARE CONCERNS ABOUT RETENTION AND ESPECIALLY RETENTION ON TEACHERS OF COLOR. YOU CAN TALK ABOUT RECRUIT BUDGET IF YOUR LOSING PEOPLE OUT THE DOOR. I SHARE EVERYONE'S CONCERN ABOUT TRANSPORTATION. ONE THING WE HEARD IN MY OFFICE IS A CONCERN OF A BUNCH OF PARENTS WHO HAVE ONE TO ONE BUS MONITORS FINDING THEMSELVES FREOUENTLY IN A SITUATION WHERE THEY'RE CALLED TO PICK UP THEIR STUDENTS BECAUSE THE BUS MONITOR IS OUT THAT DAY. TENDS TO HAPPEN ON MONDAY AND FRIDAYS. I KNOW WE HAVE A HARD TIME RETAKE MONITORS BUT THE STUDENTS WHO HAVE THAT SUPPORT HAVE IT BECAUSE OF THEIR I.E.D.s AND THEIR FAMILIES ARE COUNTING ON IT SO I WANT TO TALK ABOUT HOW WE SECURE THAT FRONT. SCHOOL SAFETY. I THINK DEFINITELY CONCERNED ABOUT HOW WE'RE THINKING ABOUT REORGANIZING OUR SCHOOLS, VIS A VIS PUBLIC HEALTH THIS FALL AND WE START HAVING THE CONVERSATIONS IN THE CAPITAL BUDGET HEARING ON TUESDAY BUT IT WOULD BE GOOD TO CONTINUE THEM. I AGREE ON FOOD. WHAT I WANT TO UNDERSTAND ON FOOD AND COUNCILLOR MEJIA MADE REFERENCE A COUPLE TIMES THERE'S A LARGE CONTRACT WITH THE COMPANY AND SIMULTANEOUS TO

HAVING THAT CONTRACT WE ADDED EXPERIENCE IN TERMS OF MY WAY CAFE TO GIVE OUR STUDENTS ACCESS

TO FRESH FOOD WHICH IS GREAT AND NOW WE ALSO HAVE THIS QUESTION OF HOW WE CAN USE OUR B.P.S. AND OTHER INSTITUTIONAL FOOD BUDGETS IN THE CITY TO SUPPORT THE ECONOMIC RECOVERY. I'D LOVE TO HEAR STRATEGICALLY HOW THEY'RE THINKING ABOUT THAT. AND I DID ASK A BIT ALREADY ABOUT ATHLETICS BUT TO ME THERE'S A REAL OPPORTUNITY HERE IN MAKING LEMON JAED -- LEMONADE AND HOW DO WE DO THAT'S SCALEABLE AND SUPPORTING SCHOOLS THAT DON'T HAVE GREAT GYM FACILITIES. THOSE ARE MY QUESTIONS AND SIMILARLY WILL SAVE AND I HAVE A BUNCH MORE I'LL SAVE FOR A SECOND ROUND IN DEFERENCE TO COLLEAGUES. WITH THAT WELL GO BACK UP TO THE SECOND ROUND OF QUESTIONS, COUNCILLOR BREADON YOU HAVE THE FLORIDA AND THEN COUNCILLOR O'MALLEY. COUNCILLOR BREADON. >> AS A THERAPIST THAT WORKED IN SCHOOLS I'M WORRIED ABOUT SERVICE PROVIDERS. HOW MANY SPEECH PATHOLOGISTS AND O.T.s ARE ON STAFF. HOW MUCH OF THE BUCKET DOES THAT EAT -- BUDGET DOES THAT EAT UP. I ECHO SOME OF YOUR CONCERNS AROUND ONE TO ONE MONITORS ON TRANSPORTATION. WHAT PROPORTION OF THE TRANSPORTATION BUDGET [TECHNICAL DIFFICULTIES] OR IS THERE A NURSE TO GO WITH THEM ON TRANSPORTATION? ON ATHLETICS IT'S GREAT THEY'VE AVAILED THEMSELVES OF PARTICIPATION IN COMPETITIVE SUPPORTS TO SCHOOL. MY CONCERN IS THAT WE NEED TO REALLY HAVE A ROBUST PHYSICAL **EDUCATION CURRICULUM SO STUDENTS** WHO ARE NOT NECESSARILY TEND TO GO TOWARDS COMPETITIVE SPORTS AS MUCH AS THAT WOULD BE DESIRABLE

BUT TO DEVELOP A CULTURE IN THE

SCHOOL OR STUDENT POPULATION THAT WOULD ENJOY AND BE EXPOSED TO A RANGE OF PHYSICAL ACTIVITIES THAT WOULD FIT THEIR PREFERENCES SO THEY WOULD DEVELOP A LIFE LONG HABIT OF PHYSICAL EXERCISE WHICH WOULD BE VERY CONDUCIVE TO LONG-TERM HEALTH AND WELLNESS. YOGA AND OTHER PHYSICAL EDUCATION CURRICULUM THAT WOULD HAVE LONG-TERM IMPACT ON THE HEALTH AND WELLNESS OF THE POPULATION ESPECIALLY SINCE IN THIS COVID CRISIS WE'RE SEEING ALL THESE INEQUITIES AND HOW VULNERABLE OUR POPULATIONS ARE IN TERMS OF SUSCEPTIBILITY TO COVID BECAUSE FOLKS HAVE A PRE-EXISTING CONDITION SUCH AS DIABETES.

I THINK HAVING A REALLY ROBUST PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM IN ALL OF OUR SCHOOLS WOULD GO A LONG WAY IN ADDRESSING THAT. I HAD A QUESTION ABOUT PARTNERSHIPS IN TERM OF WHO ARE OUR PARTNERS.

NON-PROFIT PARTNERS, BUSINESS PARTNERS, COLLEGE STUDENT AND UNIVERSITY AND COLLEGE PARTNERSHIPS.

DO THEY BRING SOMETHING TO THE TABLE OR DO WE PAY FOR IT? THERE WAS A PARTNERSHIP RECENTLY, I CAN'T REMEMBER THE PROGRAM, BUT ONE I ASSUMED B.C. WAS PROVIDING FOR A LOCAL SCHOOL BUT THEN I HEARD THEY GET PAID OUT OF THE SCHOOL BUDGET TO DO IT.

I'M WONDERING WHAT THAT RELATIONSHIP LOOKS LIKE AND WOULD LIKE MORE DETAILS OF THAT PROGRAM.

IT'S JUST HAS GONE OFF THE TOP OF MY HEAD RIGHT NOW AND I'M A STRONG ADVOCATE FOR A STRONG PHYSICAL EDUCATION PROGRAM. ALSO AS A SCHOOL, HIGH SCHOOL ATHLETE I WENT THE WHOLE WAY THROUGH STILL PLAYING FIELD HOCKEY WHEN I WAS ALMOST 40. THAT LIFELONG HABIT OF PLAYING IN A COMPETITIVE SPORT DOES A LOT OF TO DEVELOP CHARACTER AND DISCIPLINE IN OUR STUDENTS. HAVING A STRONG ATHLETE PROGRAM IS IMPORTANT TOO.

I FEEL PHYSICAL EDUCATION IS IMPORTANT FOR ALL OF OUR STUDENTS.

AND JUST IN GENERAL WHEN SCHOOL RE-OPENS HOPEFULLY IN SEPTEMBER WITH THE PROTOCOLS IN PLACE ARE ALSO MINDFUL OF CREATING A SAFE ENVIRONMENT FOR OUR KIDS. I THINK THAT THAT IS IT FOR ME. I'LL TAKE ONE MORE LOOK AND IF THERE IS MORE I'LL ASK IT IN ONE MORE ROUND BUT I THINK THAT'S

THANK YOU, MADAME CHAIR. >> THANK YOU, COUNCILLOR

ESSAIBI-GEORGE.

I'LL GO TO COUNCIL PRESIDENT JANEY AND THEN COUNCILLOR MEJIA. COUNCILLOR JANEY.

>> I APOLOGIZE I HAD TO TAKE A CALL AND THAT'D VOLUME DOWN TOO LOW SO I DIDN'T HEAR YOU IF YOU WERE CALLING ME EARLIER. I WANTED TO COME BACK TO SOME OF

THE ITEMS.

WHEN I SAID RETENTION I WAS TALKING ABOUT STUDENT RETENTION BUT IF WE'RE TALKING ABOUT THE

WORKFORCE I'D CHIME IN AND ECHO WHAT YOU SAID, CHAIR BOK AND WHAT COUNCILLOR MEJIA SAID IN TERMS OF PART OF OUR TEACHER DIVERSITY ISSUE IS ABOUT WE'RE LOSING TEACHERS OF COLOR FASTER THAN WE'RE BRINGING THEM IN THE FRONT DOOR.

THAT'S BEEN A CHALLENGE A NUMBER OF YEARS.

I SUPPORT THAT.

AS IT RELATES TO STUDENT RETENTION I'D ASK FOR DATA, A BREAKDOWN OF WHO'S BEING RETAINED.

A BREAKDOWN BY RACE AND BY LANGUAGE AND BY PROGRAM AREAS. SO IF THERE'S ANY STUDENTS WITH ACCESSIBILITIES AND WHAT PLANS WE HAVE FOR SUPPORTING STUDENTS. WE KNOW FROM MANY REPORTS THAT HAVE COME OUT THAT IT'S IMPORTANT FOR STUDENTS TO LEARN WITH THEIR PEERS AND CONTINUE TO MOVE ON WITH THEIR PEERS.
OBVIOUSLY, WE DON'T WANT THEM TO

MOVE ON WITH GAPS.BUT IF THERE'S A WAY TO RECOVER THAT IF THE SUMMER OR EXTRA TUTORIAL PROGRAM, I THINK WE HAVE TO LOOK AT THAT BECAUSE OF THE

CONNECTION BETWEEN STUDENTS WHO ARE RETAKE -- PARTICULARLY BEING RETAINED MORE THAN ONCE IN THE DROPOUT RATE.

I'D LIKE DATA IN TERMS OF WHAT THE NUMBERS LOOK LIKE IN TERMS OF STUDENT DEMOGRAPHICS. ON THE SCHOOL SAFETY -- LIKE I'D BE INTERESTED OVERALL WHAT WE DO WITH THE NUMBERS.

I'M SURE LOTS OF FOLKS HAVE SAID THIS BUT IF THE GOAL IS TO DO PHYSICAL DISTANCING WHEN WE ARE BACK TOGETHER, IT SUGGESTS PERHAPS SMALLER GROUPS GETTING TOGETHER AND STAFF TO BE WITH YOUNG PEOPLE.

I DON'T FLOW IF IT WAS YOU CHAIR BOK, BUT ON THE NUTRITION AND WHERE WE ARE IN THE CONTRACT WITH REVOLUTION BECAUSE TO MY POINT, I THINK THERE'S AN OPPORTUNITY WITH SMALLER VENDORS LIKE CITY FRESH AND MAYBE SOME OTHERS THAT ARE LOCAL THAT ARE FRESH AND IF WE'RE ON THAT FINAL YEAR, I'D LIKE TO UNDERSTAND THAT. AND IF SO, WHAT ARE THE PLANS FOR A NEW R.F.P. WITH PARTNERSHIPS, IF THESE ARE EXTERNAL B.P.S. PARTNERSHIPS. THERE WAS AN EFFORT UNDERWAY YEARS AGO TO DO AN ANALYSIS OF WHAT THE NEEDS WERE IN CERTAIN SCHOOLS AND WHAT THE PARTNERS WERE OFFERING AND WHETHER THAT WAS A GOOD MATCH OR IF IT WAS EFFECTIVE AND SOME OF THE CHANGES, I'M NOT SURE IF THAT IS STILL THE CASE, BUT IF IT IS, I WOULD BE INTERESTED IN UPDATING A REPORT ON THAT. AND IF THERE ARE ANY E TERM PARTNERS WHO HAVE STEPPED UP

FINANCIALLY TO SUPPORT OUR SCHOOLS, I WOULD BE INTERESTED IN THAT AND, CERTAINLY, I THINK ALL WOULD BE VERY GRATEFUL FOR THAT KIND OF SUPPORT, BUT I WOULD IMAGINE MANY OF OUR EXTERNAL PARTNERS, THEY, TOO, ARE FACING MANY OF THE CHALLENGES THAT EVERYONE ELSE IS FACING, AND, SO, IF THERE ARE --YOU KNOW, IF THEY ARE FACING SO MANY CHALLENGES THAT THEY CAN'T DO WHAT THEY USED TO DO. I WOULD BE INTERESTED IN WHERE WE ARE ON THOSE PARTNERSHIPS. THEN, WITH GRADUATION, I WOULD

GRADUATION RATES AND DROPOUT RATES DEMOGRAPHICALLY BY RACE, LANGUAGE AND ABILITY.
AND THEN SIMILAR QUESTIONS, I THINK IT WAS COUNCILLOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE, AROUND AGE 22, I THINK IT WAS LAST YEAR THAT THERE WAS A LOT OF ADVOCACY FOR STUDENTS WHO WERE FALLING THROUGH THIS CRACK, AND IT SEEMS LIKE SUCH A SIMPLE FIX, AND WE SHOULD NOT BE ALLOWING SOME TECHNICALITY OF WHEN YOUR BIRTHDAY FALLS, MEANING WE'RE GIVING THE STUDENTS THE BOOT,

LIKE A BREAKDOWN IN TERMS OF

WHEN, FOR MANY OF THE STUDENTS WE WERE TALKING ABOUT LAST YEARERS THIS WAS LIKE HOME TO THEM.

IT WAS LIKE YOU WERE KICKING THEM OUT OF THEIR HOUSE, AND

DAYS TILL GRADUATION, IT WAS CRUEL. SO I WANT TO AFFIRM WHAT COUNCILLOR ESSAIBI-GEORGE, WHAT

I THINK I WAS HEARING YOU SAY --LIKE I SAID, I WAS ON A CALL, SO I WAS A LITTLE DISTRACTED -- BUT I WANT TO AFFIRM THAT, IF THAT'S WHERE YOU WERE GOING AND I THINK

WE AS A BODY SHOULD FIGURE OUT

WHAT TO DO ABOUT THAT, YOU KNOW,

WHETHER THAT'S A STATE FIX AT THE STATE LEVEL OR SOMETHING

THAT WE CAN DO HERE OR LOBBYING

THE SCHOOL COMMITTEE, OR

WHATEVER IT IS, BECAUSE THAT WAS

JUST REALLY RIDICULOUS.

SO I WOULD LIKE TO SEE WHERE WE

ARE IN TERMS OF WHO'S IN THE

PROGRAMS AND, AGAIN, A BREAKDOWN

BY RACE AND HOW SUCCESSFUL WE

ARE. AND THEN IT CONTINUES TO INVEST IF THIS IS SOMETHING THAT

WE THINK MAKES SENSE AND WE

CAN'T BE KICKING FOLKS OUT.

SO THAT IS IT, I THINK, FOR ME,

ON THESE ISSUES.

I APPRECIATE IT MADAM CHAIR,

(INDISCERNIBLE) AND WONDERING WHAT INFRASTRUCTURE IS USED TO SUPPORT THE LEARNING LOSS FOR THIS POPULATION.

AND IN REGARDS TO GRADUATION AND CAREER READINESS, I'M INTERESTED IN MORE THAN JUST CAREER READINESS.

I WOULD LIKE TO KNOW WHAT PLANS ARE IN PLACE FOR LIFE READINESS. HOW ARE WE HANDLING LIFE SKILLS IN OUR SCHOOLS AND WHAT RESOURCES ARE NEEDED TO MAKE THEM A REALITY.

I HAVE A PROBLEM WITH WHERE
PEOPLE CROSS SOFT SKILLS.

SO IF YOU'RE INTERESTED IN THAT QUESTION, I REALLY WANT TO TALK ABOUT OUR SUMMER SCHOOLS.
IT HAS COME UP IN EVERY HEARING, THE COUNCIL PRESIDENT REFERRED TO THAT.
