


TREMONT STREET DESIGN PROJECT

- Help them realize their goals related to transportation and safety



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
The project area is bounded by, but does not include Columbus, Mass Ave., and Melnea Cass.


Build a collaborative process with community members to:








WHAT WE'VE DONE SO FAR



OPEN HOUSES

- We hosted open houses in four locations
- We shared key themes, including places that received a lot of love




OPEN HOUSES

- We shared themes from people's ideas for improving safety
- We heard a lot about **safety** for people biking and walking and improving accessibility and walkability

WHAT WE'VE heard SO FAR



Community members shared 297 IDEAS for how to improve transportation for people riding the bus, walking, biking, and driving or parking.



We heard many comments about improving safety for people walking and biking. We also heard a lot about improving bus service, accessibility, and walkability in the neighborhood.



86 discussed safety for people walking or biking



60 were about better bus service



31 mentioned accessibility 20 proposed new or safer crosswalks



suggested improving sidewalks

"Better wayfinding and markers related to neighborhood history: Frederick Douglass, Melnea Cass, MLK Eustis St. and Harriet Tubman House."

"Crossing is dangerous and difficult on foot because of conflicts with cars."



"Smoother roads for biking and skateboarding."

"Blind people have a hard time crossing the street. We need countdown timers with sounds at intersections."

"The Silver Line is good."

"We need another crosswalk on Washington St at Ball Street."

"Frederick Dougless Way has no stop sign at the corner of Tremont - can we add a stop sign?"



"You want enough space for kids to play and ride bikes."

"Bumpy sidewalks on Tremont near Melnea Cass. Elderly people stay inside because the sidewalks are bumpy and hazardous."

We shared about the **types** of changes we could use to address people's comments

Envision YOUR STREETS IN LOWER ROXBURY

Below are some types of changes we could use to make it safer and more enjoyable to travel on Lower Roxbury streets. What do you think would be effective, and where?

CROSSWALK



Creates a marked location where people can cross the

Includes curb ramps and crosswalk striping.

CROSSWALK "DAYLIGHTING"



Improves visibility for people crossing the street. Restricts parking 20 ft. before the crosswalk.

BIKE FACILITIES



Creates dedicated space on the street for people riding bicycles.

Various types of bike facilities are possible depending on street characteristics.

RAISED CROSSWALK



Improves pedestrian safety by reducing vehicle speeds near crosswalks.

Used on local streets and along major streets but not across major streets.

SIGNAL TIMING CHANGE



Gives pedestrians a head start, adds more "Walk" time to signals, or both.

CURB MANAGEMENT



Prioritizes the curb for specific uses, such as:

- · Short-term parking
- · Passenger pickup/
- dropoff zones · Commercial Loading
- Metered parking

CROSSING ISLAND



Shortens the distance for people crossing the street.

People cross one direction of travel at a time.

Designated with striping and "flexposts" or a raised

SPEED HUMPS



Lower driver speeds and improve safety on local streets.

Used only on minor streets.

SPEED FEEDBACK SIGN



Interactive sign that alerts drivers of their speed and if they are exceeding the speed


Can help lower vehicle speeds.







WHAT WE'VE DONE SO FAR



SPRING & SUMMER 2020

- Active Transportation Team shifts to provide relief during COVID-19.
 (BPS food deliveries, unemployment claims, rental relief)
- Cautious about re-engaging in planning work
 - COVID-19's disproportionate impact on Boston's black residents and other communities of color.
 - O George Floyd and Breonna Taylor's murders and Boston's response to its own realities of racism and police brutality.
- One on one check-ins with community partners to understand if transportation remained a priority for discussion.

OUTREACH ADVISORY GROUP

Help us communicate and collaborate with the communities in Lower Roxbury right now.

* This is not the place where decisions about outcomes will be made.

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EXPECTATIONS FOR US

We will:

- Host outreach advisory group meetings quarterly, with ample notice.
- ▶ Be accountable to you with regular communication.
- Respectfully engage with the outreach advisory group and community members.
- Incorporate your advice and recommendations about outreach, as best as we are able.
- Make decisions transparently.

GROUP EXPECTATIONS

- Make a good faith effort to attend outreach advisory group meetings.
- ► Engage respectfully with one other, with the project team, with community members.
- Share your knowledge and experience.
- Communicate back to your communities about the project.

DISCUSSION

CONFIRMING DISCUSSION THEMES

► Transparency about how decisions will be made.

We (BTD) will make decisions transparently and communicate with this group and the public about how these decisions were made. Even if we are not able to take some of the advice provided, we will communicate the reasoning for that clearly.

Role of the group and how it will affect these decisions.

- ▶ The conversations this group will have will focus on how to create an inclusive process—not the particular outcomes of that process.
- ▶ The types of things we are hoping to discuss include:
 - How to design outreach that's likely to work for folks in your communities, even when we can't gather in person?
 - How we can go at an appropriate pace—not going too fast because we know there's a lot going on, but still moving forward because we all want to see tangible improvements, and soon?
 - How we can engage those who have been left out of processes in Boston and whose voices are not heard as often?

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
