

PROCUREMENT ENHANCEMENTS

New Equitable Procurement Process

- Affirmative Marketing to M/WBEs
 - Requires certified vendors to be included in every procurement
 - **278** Equitable procurements completed in 2020

• Equitable Procurement Plan

Every department submitted their plan to spend with diverse vendors for FY 22

• Training for City Departments

Over **120** City buyers have been trained on Equitable Procurement practices

Up to \$15,000 in direct grants

\$2.5 million available to Boston M/WBE, VOSB, and SLBE Certified Businesses directly impacted by the COVID-19 pandemic.

- **48%** to Black-owned businesses
- **55%** to woman-owned businesses

Business Outreach Meetings



To hear directly from business owners about their experience contracting with the City and doing business in Boston

- Held 7 public forums in Codman Square, Copley, East Boston, Fields Corner, Jamaica Plain, Mattapan, and Roxbury
- Collected information through surveys, written testimony, oral testimony and in depth interviews
- Established the **Supplier Diversity Advisory Council** with 24 advocates and business owners





EXECUTIVE ORDER OVERVIEW

An Executive Order Establishing Equitable Procurement Goals for Minority and Woman-owned Businesses

- <u>Immediate</u>: 25% Annual Discretionary Spend goal with minority- and woman-owned businesses
 - \Box 10% with MBEs
 - \Box 15% with WBEs
 - Highest spending goal ever for the City of Boston
 - Applied across all industries and departments
- <u>Within 6 months</u>: Establish a process for determining raceand gender-conscious goals on **individual contracts** as well as a process for **evaluating and monitoring compliance**.
- **By FY2023**: Require **goal tracking and reporting as part of the annual budget process**.
- Establishes a new **Supplier Diversity Program** to oversee the implementation of this Executive Order along with the 2019 Equitable Procurement Executive Order.

\$2M Investment in Staffing and Resources to support M/WBEs

• Oversee Contract Goal Setting

Oversee the implementation of the Executive Order along with a 2019 Executive order related to equitable procurement.

- Ensure Full Participation of M/WBEs Ensure the City's policies, practices and processes foster the full participation of M/WBEs in pursuing contracting opportunities.
- Strategic Capacity Building

Develop strategic capacity building programs to help Minority and Woman-owned businesses compete for City contracts. Including:

- I Technical Assistance
- □ Financial Support
- Training and Mentoring programs
