
RESULTS OF 2010 ARCHAEOLOGICAL INVESTIGATION LATHROP HOUSE BASEMENT PAUL REVERE MEMORIAL ASSOCIATION BOSTON, MASSACHUSETTS

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INTRODUCTION




Figure 1. Location of the Paul Revere Memorial Association.

Independent Archaeological Consulting, LLC (IAC) completed a survey at the Lathrop House, located at 5-6 Lathrop Place (Figure 1). The Lathrop house is a component of the Paul Revere House historical complex which consists of three buildings. The Paul Revere Memorial Association (PRMA) lies east of Hanover Street and west of North Square in the North End of Boston. The 2010 archaeology effort took place in the basement of the Lathrop House, as part of a renovation and expansion of the historic Paul Revere House complex. The acquisition of the property location at 5-6 Lathrop Place allowed the Paul Revere Memorial Association to expand the property to include an education and visitor orientation center. The renovation and conversion of the Lathrop House into a 3,600-ft² visitor center required a significant degree of restoration, including structural repairs to the foundation. The 2010 archaeological survey focused on the identification of archaeological features present in the basement as well as assisting the structural engineer in determining the integrity of the foundation and the depth of the historic walls.

In July of 2010, IAC excavated three excavation units (EUs) in the basement of the Lathrop House. For the sake of brevity, we will use a shorthand to differentiate the EUs by calling them the North Unit, South Unit, and East Unit. All three of the EUs contained cultural material, for a total of 2,937 Euroamerican and two pre-Contact-period artifacts, with an additional 24 artifacts collected from the courtyard drain and dirt surface beneath the porch (Table 1). Altogether, IAC retrieved 2,963 artifacts from the 2010 field effort.




Figure 2. Layout of Lathrop House, with archaeological grid and room designations.

The 2010 testing revealed multiple deposits of artifacts, with some dating to the 1600s and 1700s. The north unit was beneath a deck floor (Figure 2), where IAC encountered a brick feature that is likely related to the privy identified by Boston University in their 1983 investigation (Elia 1997). In the south unit, archaeologists found mixed deposits, with materials ranging from the seventeenth century to the twentieth. In the east unit, archaeologists revealed several distinct deposits, with materials no later than the 1830s, except from loci directly against the foundation. In this excavation unit, IAC found North Devon gravel-tempered redware, Westerwald and other Rhenish stoneware, tin-glazed enamel, English white salt-glazed stoneware, and buff-colored coarse earthenware in sizable quantities, along with other domestic refuse (mammal and fish bones, and dark green bottle glass). Because the deposits had clear horizontal and vertical boundaries, we find that the east unit has the best evidence of the least disturbance. We believe the artifacts derived from backyard deposits related to the Paul Revere House, before the Lathrop House was constructed in 1835-1836. We recommend additional archaeological investigation here prior to the removal of sub-floor soils for the Lathrop House renovation

This report does not include a lengthy background history of the site's occupation, but focuses on the results of the 2010 fieldwork. Further research and archaeological investigations certainly would benefit from a detailed study of the Detwiller 1976 report and the 1993 Supplementary Historic Structure Report, which show the occupation history of the PRMA complex. Figures from these reports portray a variety of outbuildings, including barns, stables, privies ("necessaries"), wood sheds, and gardens. It is within this expansive "back yard" – remote from public view – that residents from the Paul Revere and Peirce-Hichborn Houses disposed of their trash for more than 160 years before the space was covered over with the building of the duplex Lathrop House.

Because each of the three excavation units revealed such different results, it is difficult to assume that the findings apply over wide areas. The 2010 sample was considerably small – with a mere total of 4.0 m² (43 ft²) within a cellar space exceeding 100 sq m (1,076 sq ft), for a 4% sample. It may be pertinent to excavate an excavation unit in each of the two cellar rooms not sampled in 2010. These would be in the northwest and northeast rooms, as shown in Figure 2.

We do not recommend any further archaeological investigation in the vicinity of the south unit in the south room (see Figure 2), as these deposits were disturbed from heavy mixture, likely due to repairs to the foundation wall. However, if it is possible, we recommend that these deposits be excavated by hand and deposits screened for artifacts. Perhaps the PRMA can employ volunteers to assist in this artifact retrieval.




Figure 3. Location of archaeological excavation units – Boston University Units A, B, C, E, and F and IAC East, North, and South Units.

In the two other rooms we sampled in 2010, we recommend further archaeological investigation. Beneath the deck in the north part of the Lathrop House (see Figure 2), the proposed excavation is relatively shallow, yet a good proportion of the materials from this unit dated to the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries. The north unit is also very near Units C, E, and F excavated by Boston University in 1983 (Figure 3), and there remain unresolved questions about whether a brick feature (Locus 22) uncovered by IAC in 2010 is related to a brick-and-stone-drainage feature exposed by BU. Unit F was excavated against the outside of the Lathrop House, and BU found a wood-lined privy here. Because of these two features found on the outside of the Lathrop House, and the Locus 22 brick feature, we propose more testing in this north area beneath the deck.

We also propose a follow-up investigation in the cellar room where the east unit is located (see Figure 2). In the summer 2010 effort, archaeologists were not able to reach the ending depths of the buried foundation, even in excavating 1.3 m (4 ft) below the concrete floor. Minimally, we recommend the opening of an excavation unit large enough to permit continued excavation to the base of the wall, and to confirm the ending depths of cultural deposits in this east room. It may be that the erection of the Lathrop House covered backyard deposits that may be stratified from the time of Cotton Mather in the 1670s, through the occupation of Paul Revere a century later, and into the 1830s before the Lathrop House was built at the back edge of the lot. We believe that continued excavation of area around the east unit could yield deposits that may be traced to individual households or historic persons living in either the 1680s Paul Revere House and/or 1711 Peirce-Hichborn House.

PROJECT LOCATION

The Lathrop House is located at 5-6 Lathrop Place, within the Paul Revere Memorial Association complex at 19 North Square, Boston, Massachusetts. The complex is located east of Hanover Street and west of North Square in the urban neighborhood known as "The North End."

Prior to the acquisition of the Lathrop House, the Paul Revere Memorial Association property consisted of two extant structures, the Paul Revere House (circa 1680), the Peirce-Hichborn House (circa 1711). The property also included a fragment of the original backlot west of the Paul Revere House, a narrow strip of land along the south side of the Peirce-Hichborn house and the open space between the two houses, the latter which was the location of the 17th century Barnard house and lot. Located within a densely settled urban setting, the project location has undergone a number of alterations including the construction of and demolition of a number of structures over the past 400 years.

The Lathrop House, built in 1835, by house wrights John Perkins and Jonathan Robinson, stands on land that was once encompassed by the Paul Revere family property. An analysis of historic maps and overlays indicate the location of the Lathrop house was once the backyard of the Paul Revere house, a place in which many of the daily household activities historically took place. Structures located in the backyard of the Paul Revere house included a stable, barn and privies. Also located to the west of the Paul Revere house, in the backyard, were spaces for gardening and trash disposal. Although the footprint of the house has not changed since 1835, the house has undergone several alterations over the past 175 years. Presently, the structure has a multichambered basement with four "rooms" and a fifth exterior room located underneath a porch. The interior rooms of the basement are presently covered with a concrete floor, also located within the basement are a number of utilities, the hot water heater and electrical box. The exterior room currently has a dirt floor, overlying porch is comprised of decking in which the widely spaced slats allow for rainwater to leak onto the dirt floor below, causing the soil to be heavily saturated.

METHODOLOGY

The goal of the archaeological study was to sample deposits removed from against the basement foundation, so that the project architect and structural engineer could assess the condition of the foundation walls. Initially, the soils against the foundation were removed by workers, until high numbers of artifacts were noted. The soil removed by workers was screened under the supervision of City Archaeologist Ellen Berkland. Nina Zannieri, Executive Director of the Paul Revere Memorial Association (PRMA), invited IAC to conduct controlled sampling in three different parts of the basement. IAC archaeologists conducted the fieldwork on July 13, 28, 29, 2010 under the direction of Principal Investigator, Dr. Wheeler and Field Supervisor Jacob Tumelaire, who were assisted by field technicians Jon Douse and Jessica Kramer.

The location of the three excavation units was selected by the structural engineer, who removed a section of concrete pavement against three corners of the basement. The pavement cuts measured approximately 1.3 m by 1.3 m (4 ft by 4 ft). Dr. Wheeler used the southwest corner of the basement as the site datum N200 E200, so that excavation units could be assigned Cartesian coordinates. The three excavation units were as follows:

- N200 E200 (TU South), located in the southwestern corner of the cellar
- N203.3 E207.5 (TU East), located in the southeast corner of the cellar
- N208.3 E208.1 (TU North), located in the northeast corner, on the exterior of the cellar, beneath an exterior porch

These three units will be alternatively designated as the south unit, east unit, and north unit, for ease of description in the following text. The excavation units and their locations are visible in Figure 2. N200 E200 – the south unit – was located in the southwest corner of the cellar, measured 110 cm (3.6 ft) east-west and 120 cm (3.9 ft) north-south, and was excavated to a depth of 85 cm (2.8 ft) below the modern concrete floor.

IAC excavated N202.3 E207.5 (the east unit) in the southeastern corner of the cellar, where the EU measured 130 cm (4.2 ft) east-west and 125 cm (4.1 ft) north-south. This EU was excavated over most of the area to a depth of 65 cm (2.1 ft) below the modern concrete floor, with an exploratory trench dug to an ending depth of 1.3 m (4.2 ft) against the east foundation wall of the east room. As noted above, archaeologists did not reach the base of this foundation-stone cellar wall.

The north unit, N208.3 E208.1, was located beneath an exterior deck floor, where floorboards did not prevent rain water from entering the room, leaving behind saturated deposits. The north unit measured 110 cm (3.6 ft) east-west and 120 cm (3.9 ft) north-south and was excavated to a depth of 85 cm (2.8 ft) below a datum established in the northwest corner. Because the third EU was excavated within a dirt floor, archaeologists were able to establish a datum stake located 10 cm above the dirt floor. In the later two TUs, measurements were made from a designated spot at the top of the concrete floor, the modern ground surface. The total area tested during the archaeological survey was 4.27 m² (46 ft²).

Due to the complicated nature of the various deposits, IAC employed the locus system of stratigraphic identification; this system is similar to the one used by Boston University in 1983. Archaeologists excavated the EUs by natural and cultural strata, with each separate deposit given a locus number. Loci exceeding 10 cm in thickness were further excavated in arbitrary 10-cm levels. Crew members screened all loci deposits through ¼-inch hardware mesh and placed

artifacts in bags labeled with their horizontal and vertical provenience. Archaeologists recorded soil profiles with the MunsellTM soil color, composition, and degree of compaction noted.

The basement context did not offer the best lighting conditions, and the lack of adequate lighting in the basement hampered accurate soil color identification, profile drawing, the taking of photographs, and the recovery of dark-colored artifacts (especially nails). IAC tried to rectify this with the use of drop lights to improve lighting conditions. Where possible, archaeologists took soil samples out into the natural light of the courtyard to determine Munsell color designations. Field Supervisors took photos of representative profiles and all loci, along with general views of the test area. Excavators also drafted profiles and/or plan views for all loci.

Archaeological investigations took place over the course of three weeks in July, 2010, when temperatures and humidity levels were quite high. Working conditions were cramped and uncomfortable, and IAC used box fans to move the air in the cellar rooms. During the month of July 2010, heavy rains created run-off from the scaffolding on the exterior of the Lathrop house, resulting in minor flooding in the basement of 7/8 Lathrop Place, which shares a party wall to the south of the Lathrop House. To alleviate the flooding, construction workers dug a roughly 1-m-x-1-m square hole in the courtyard between the two buildings (Plate 1). Archaeologists designated the soil from this drainage hole as Locus 12. IAC screened the Locus 12 soil separately from the EUs and collected 24 artifacts.




Figure 4. Location of three excavation units in basement of Lathrop House.

Archaeologists returned all artifacts to Nina Zannieri to be turned over to Boston City Archaeologist Ellen Berkland for processing and analysis. Artifacts were cleaned, identified, and cataloged under the supervision of Ellen Berkland. The data were then given to IAC in an Excel

file, and IAC imported the data into a Microsoft Access© database program for additional analysis. Each of the three excavation units (Figure 4) is considered individually below.

N202.3 E207.5 (East unit)

As shown in Figure 3, N202.3 E207.5 is in the southeast corner of the cellar, and is bound to the south by a cinder-block foundation wall and to and east by a mortared fieldstone foundation wall. The east unit measured 1.3 m (4.2 ft) by 1.25 m (4.1 ft), and was excavated to an ending depth of 0.65 m (2.1 ft) below the concrete pavement, which reached the base of the southern cinder-block wall. IAC excavated a narrow trench against the east foundation wall to a final depth of 1.3 m (4.2 ft) [Plate 2], where the base of the foundation wall was not exposed.




Figure 5. Harris Matrix for N202.3 E207.5, showing the stratification and relation of 13 loci.

Archaeologists excavated this unit over the course of two field days, identifying 13 loci (Loci 1-7, 21, and 23-27), including what appears to be a clay-packed (L. 3) metal-hooped barrel privy (L. 21) in the southwest corner of the east unit (Plate 3). Figure 5 is a Harris Matrix of the 13 deposits, showing how each of them related to one another. Prior to excavation, archaeologists scraped the surface of the EU to aid in the identification of underlying features or loci. The uppermost deposit surface was designated as Locus 1, a dark gray (10YR 4/1) silty clay loam of loose compaction; i. e., the dusty layer immediately beneath the concrete floor.




Figure 6. Location of excavation unit N202.3 E208.1 in southeast corner of Lathrop House cellar. The figure shows the various loci exposed immediately beneath the Locus 1 "dust" layer.

At 18 cm (7 in) below the basement concrete floor, archaeologists identified five additional loci (Figure 6). Locus 2 (L. 2) is an artifact-laden deposit composed of a dark gray (10YR 4/1) silty clay loam of moderate compaction, and covers the majority of the floor of the EU. Several ceramic sherds with a variety of ware types were recovered from within L. 2, including sherds of Westerwald, English salt glazed stoneware, and a Nottingham-type fragment embossed with the letters "BOS". At the western margin of the east unit, Locus 3 (L.3) is a semi-circular clay feature that on the surface appears to be a "plug" or a cap to a down-cutting feature, with a darker area (L. 21) inside the circular deposit of clay (see Figure 6; Plate 3). Locus 3 is a compact, grayish brown (2.5Y 5/2) clay, with very few artifacts. In the opposite corner of the east unit, archaeologists noted a second clay locus in the northeastern corner, identified as Locus 4 (L. 4). Locus 4 is a dark grayish brown (10YR 4/2) silty clay loam of heavy compaction and is bound to the south by Locus 5 (L. 5), and to the west by L. 2. Locus 4 contained several fieldstones, which distinguished it from Locus 5, into which Locus 4 cut.




Plate 3. Clay lined barrel privy, packed with clay. View south.

Locus 5 is a linear deposit, oriented north-south along the margin of the eastern foundation wall. L. 5 is composed of a grayish brown (10YR 5/2) silty clay loam of loose compaction, the likely result of rodent burrow activity, whose evidence was noted by archaeologists during excavation. Locus 5 is a repair trench for the east foundation wall, while Locus 4 is likely to be a "patch repair" pit, which cut into the L. 5 trench at a later period in time. Both of these loci contained pearlware and whiteware, dating to 1820s and 1830s.




Figure 7. South wall profile of the northern half of TU East N202.3 E207.5.

Due to time constraints and the complex nature of deposits in the east unit, IAC excavated the northern half of the unit during the initial visit, continuing the excavation of the southern half on July 29, 2010. Prior to excavating the north half of the unit, IAC drew the south profile of the excavated northern half, discovering an additional locus (Locus 26) that had not been present in the north half of the unit. The profile drawing is shown as Figure 7.

Archaeologists found a series of deposits with clear horizontal and vertical boundaries that overly one another. To the west is the clay-wrapped barrel privy, which was only partially exposed. Along the eastern cellar wall are at least two downcutting trenches – Loci 4 and 5 – that are probably associated with builders trenches and subsequent maintenance and repair activities. To further complicate the interpretation, archaeologists noted several rodent burrows that cause the intermixture of artifacts. The individual deposits are reviewed below.

Locus 2 was approximately 40 cm thick, contained four 10-cm levels, and terminated at a depth of 50 cm (1.8 ft) below the modern concrete floor (abbreviated as cmbs hereafter). Artifact density within L.2 was fairly high, with 945 Euroamerican artifacts recovered. A linear soil anomaly oriented roughly north-south is located along the eastern margin of L. 2 and separates L. 2 from L. 5. This anomaly was later identified in the wall profile as a rodent burrow and was assigned the designation of Locus 26 (L. 26). Locus 26 measures approximately 11 cm in thickness, and is encountered at 20 cmbs and terminates at 31 cmbs. The soil of L. 26 is a dark gray (10YR 4/1) silty clay loam of moderate compaction mottled with a grayish brown (10YR 5/2), also a silty clay loam of moderate compaction.

Locus 2 formed a clear wavy boundary with the underlying Locus 6. Locus 6 is a gray (10 YR 5/1) silty clay loam of moderate compaction. At the interface between Loci 2 and 6, several large ceramic sherds were noted. Locus 6 was a fairly thin stratum (41-48 cmbs) and forms a clear wavy boundary with the underlying Locus 23.

Locus 23 is an olive brown (2.5Y 4/3) silty clay loam of moderate to heavy compaction. The top of Locus 23 was at 45 cmbs, but its ending depth was not reached. When excavation of the EU ceased at 81 cmbs, the top of L.23/4 was visible. A number of artifacts were recovered within L. 23, including fragments of a Delft tile, redware, creamware, oyster shell, faunal bone, mortar, charcoal, and a sherd of a comb decorated buff-bodied earthen ware. At 58 cmbs Locus 24 was identified, screened and bagged separately, after review of the wall profile, L. 24 was determined to be L. 23, but slightly less compacted and slightly mottled.

The stratigraphy against the eastern foundation wall is fairly complex. Locus 4 terminates at 43 cmbs. At the base of L. 4 is a small cluster of sub-angular cobbles and a partial brick. Locus 4 is overlying Locus 5, and appears to have been cut or truncated into L.5. Locus 5 extends into the 1-m-x-0.5-m exploratory trench dug along the eastern margin, with the base of L. 5 is at 91 cmbs. Locus five contains eight levels, all of which contained Euroamerican material for a number of _ artifacts recovered. Locus 5 is bound to the west by L. 26, L, 2, L. 6, L. 23. Underlying L. 5 is Locus 27, the top of which was encountered at 91 cmbs (in the exploratory excavation trench). The base of L. 27 was not achieved as it extended beyond the margin of excavation. Locus 27 is composed of a very dark grayish brown (2.5Y 3/2) silty clay loam of loose to moderate compaction.

Located in the western half of the EU is a clay-lined barrel privy, the cut of the pavement reveals on the eastern half of the privy. The clay cap and clay lining on the exterior of the privy is assigned the locus designation of L. 3. First encountered at 18 cmbs, Locus 3 is composed of a grayish brown (2.5Y 5/2) clay of heavy compaction. The semi-circular cap measured 85 cm in diameter (north-south), with a radius of 45 cm (east-west). Overall, artifact density within Locus 3 was low, with very few artifacts recovered. Once the clay cap was removed, Locus 21 was identified. Locus 21 is encapsulated within the interior of the Locus 3 ring of clay. Composed of a very dark grayish brown (2.5 Y 3/2) silty clay loam of moderated to heavy compaction, artifact density was also fairly low. At the base of the EU, at an elevation of 68 cmbs, the metal ring of a barrel is visible.

N200 E200




Figure 8. Harris matrix for N200 E200, showing the stratification and relation of six loci.

N200 E200 is located in the extreme south west corner of the cellar, and is bound along the south and west walls by a mortared field stone foundation and associated cellar walls (Figure 3). Both walls show evidence of recent repair attempts using concrete. Located along the southern wall is a mortared fieldstone foundation underlying the cellar wall, this foundation created a lip that extended 20 cm north into the EU. The EU with the lip included, measures 110 cm east-west and 120 cm north-south, and was excavated to a depth of 85 centimeters below the modern concrete floor. Archaeologists identified a total of six Loci (Loci # 7-11, and 13) in N200 E200 (Figure 8). Figure 7 is a Harris Matrix of the six deposits, showing how each of them related to one another.




Figure 9. Existing conditions post removal of loose debris.

Upon arrival, the western half of the EU had been excavated to a depth of 84 centimeters below the modern concrete floor. On July 13, 2010, excavation began with scraping the surface, to aid in the identification of any underlying loci, and sharpening up lines in the eastern half of the EU. The uppermost deposit of loose debris was designated as Locus 7 (Figure 9). IAC exposed Locus 7 at 20-40 cmbs, and found it comprised of a well mixed homogenous fill with a number of Euroamerican artifacts. The soil of L. 7 is a dark gray silt loam of loose to moderate compaction, which formed a clear wavy boundary with the underlying locus. Locus 7 contained a variety of artifacts ranging from wire nails (common after 1885) to Westerwald (1700-1775) ceramic fragments (Miller 2000: 10, 14), indicating a mixed context.

Excavation of the northeast corner terminated at 50 cmbs, five cm into L. 7/2. Excavation continued only in the southeast corner to expedite the excavation process of evaluation of the EU prior to the end of the day. At 55 cmbs, excavators exposed Locus 8/1 directly beneath Locus 7. Locus 8 was a homogenous fill comprised of a dark grayish brown silty clay loam of heavy compaction with a wide range of artifacts: window glass, mammal bone, shell, coal, brick, ball clay pipe stems, redware, delft, and a fragment of a buff-bodied earthenware. At 67 cmbs IAC identified a third locus – Locus 9 – and excavation ceased for the day.




Figure 10. N200 E200 with Loci 9 and 11 exposed.

Archaeologists returned on July 28, 2010 to resume excavation of N200 E200. In the northeast corner of the EU, excavators revealed Locus 10, a small soil anomaly beneath Locus 8 at 61 cmbs. Locus 10 was composed of a dark gray (10YR 4/1) silty loam of loose to moderate compaction, containing redware fragments, a ball clay pipe stem and a number of bricks pieces. Locus 10 was fairly shallow and terminated at 67 cmbs where Locus 11 was encountered. Locus 11 was initially identified in the northeastern corner as a dark gray (10YR 4/1) silty clay loam of moderate compaction. Locus 11 formed a clear abrupt boundary with Locus 9. A single artifact, a flat 2-cm-x-3-cm piece of lead was recovered from Locus 11. Excavation of Locus 9 revealed a shallow stratum, 67-74 cmbs, of dark grayish brown (10YR 4/2) silty clay loam of moderate compaction. The few artifacts from Locus 9 were non-diagnostic, as they consisted of shell and

redware sherds. Archaeologists identified Locus 9 as a builder's trench associated with maintenance or repair along the southern foundation wall, as it was oriented parallel to the wall (Figure 10) and had a sharp vertical interface.




Figure 11. Base of N200 E200 with beginning elevations of Loci 11/2 and 13/1.

At the top of the second level of Locus 11 (11/2), IAC had brought the EU down to the same elevation, where they encountered Locus 13 along the western margin of the test hole (Figure 11). Locus 13 is a very dark grayish brown (10 YR 3/2) silty clay of moderate compaction, which intruded into Locus 11 and was sandwiched between L. 11/1 and L. 11/2. Archaeologists identified Locus 13 as a rodent burrow. Archaeologist recovered few artifacts from L. 13, and these were a piece of window glass, a mammal rib, a mold made brick fragment and a sherd of earthenware ceramic with a blue handpainted tin glaze.




Figure 12. N200 E200 North and east wall profiles.

At the top of Locus 11/3, IAC conferred with Nina Zannieri and the general contractor, who confirmed that the excavation was deep enough for the purposes of the renovation process. This brought the ending depth of the EU to at 84 cmbs (2.7 ft bs). Archaeologists had not reached sterile subsoil at this depth, but they halted excavation here. IAC photographed the EU and profiled its south and west walls (Figure 12).

N208.3 E208.1




Figure 13. Harris matrix for N208.3 E208.1, showing the stratification and relation of eight loci.

N208.3 E208.1 is located in the northeast corner of the Lathrop House complex, underneath a porch (Figure 3). The exterior room currently has a dirt floor and the overlying porch is comprised of decking in which the widely spaced slats allow for rainwater to leak onto the dirt floor below, causing the soil to be heavily saturated during rainy periods. The north wall is composed of concrete and brick, this wall is a half wall that serves as a support wall for the sunken courtyard of the adjacent building. The courtyard north of the porch is significantly lower in grade than the elevation of the deposits below the porch. To the east of the EU the wall is brick, the southern wall is a modern wall comprised of cinderblocks. Archaeologists identified eight Loci in N208.3 E208.1 (Loci 14-20, and 22). Figure 13 is a Harris Matrix of the 8 deposits, showing how each of them related to one another. A number of surface artifacts were noted and collected from the dirt floor within the space under the porch, including the rim of a Westerwald tankard.

The EU measured 110 cm east-west and 120 cm north-south and was excavated to a depth of 85 centimeters below a datum established in the northwest corner. Archaeologists sharpened up the slumped wall of the EU and gave the loose soils the designation of Locus 14 (L.14/1) Locus 14/1 was comprised of 19 cm of very dark grayish brown (2.5Y 3/2) silt loam with sub-angular and angular gravels. The artifact density within L. 14/1 was fairly high and varied. Recovered within

L. 14/1 were brick fragments, mammal bone, salt glazed stoneware, Westerwald, redware, white granite, Nottingham sherds, wire nails, bottle glass, lamp chimney sherds, a mammal tooth, and a small piece of lead. An intact red clay pipe bowl with the stamped letters "RP" within a heart shaped emblem was collected from within Locus 14 (Plate 7).

After cleaning off the loose debris, three loci were identified. Locus 15 (L. 15/1) was encountered at 49 centimeters below datum (cmbd), along the southern margin of the EU. The Locus formed a right angle with Locus 16 (L. 16/1) to the northwest, and L. 14/2 to the northeast. Locus 15/1 was primarily composed of a grayish brown (2.5Y 5/2) clay of moderate to heavy compaction, mottled with a olive brown (2.5Y4/3) silty clay loam. Within Locus 15/1 a number of late 18th century ceramic sherds were recovered, including delft, salt glazed English stoneware, Jackfield and the fragments of a creamware soup plate. Locus 15/1 terminated at 59/62 cmbd when Locus 17 (L. 17/1) and Locus 19 (L. 19/1) were encountered.




Figure 14. N208.3 E208.1, top of Loci 14/2, 15/1 and 16/1.

Archaeologists identified Locus 16 (L. 16/1) along the western margin of the EU. The soil of Locus 16 is composed of a dark olive brown (2.5Y 3/3) silt loam of moderate to heavy compaction, with a number of charcoal flecks. Locus 16/1 contained a possible whet stone, corroded metal fragments, a pipe bowl, mammal bone, shell, pipe stems, and lamp chimney glass. This locus was fairly shallow (10 cm) and terminated at 59/62 cmbd, and was overlying L. 17/1. Contained within the L. 17/1 soils were a cut nail, refined earthenware fragments, amorphous chunks of corroded metal, faunal bone, and a pipe stem.




Figure 15. N208.3 E208.1, top of Loci 17/1, 18/1 and 19/1.




Plate 8. N208.3 E208.1, Loci 19 and 22, view east.

Located along the margin of the north wall and oriented east-west, a lineal arrangement of four bricks was encountered at 59 cmbs and was retroactively assigned the Locus number 22. Further excavation revealed that Locus 22 ran the length of the EU and was comprised of three courses of brick (Plate 8 and 9)). Packed along the southern margin of the brick wall was a layer of grayish brown (2.5Y 5/2) clay of heavy compaction, identified as Locus 18 (L. 18/1). Archaeologists recovered very few artifacts from L. 18/1, a mammal bone fragment and a single piece of brick. Underlying the lineal arrangement of bricks is Locus 20, a stratum of dark olive brown (2.5Y 3/3) silty loam of loose to moderate compaction. Locus 20, like Locus 18 is oriented east-west and is only visible in the profile of the north wall.

Located in the south eastern corner of N208.3 E208.1 is a semi-circular arrangement of small cobbles that line the perimeter of Locus 19 (Plate 8). Locus 19 is underlying Locus 14/2, and was encountered at 72 cmbd. A single artifact, a sherd of English salt glazed stoneware with a diaper pattern, was noted and collected at the 72 cmbd, on the surface of Locus 19. Unfortunately, excavation of Locus 19 was beyond the scope of this project. Excavation of the entire EU ceased at 72 cmbd when a sufficient depth of 25 below the last course of stones in the south and east foundation walls had been achieved and verified by Nina Zannieri.




Figure 16. N208.3 E208.1 East Wall Profile




Figure 17. N208.3 E208.1 North and West Wall Profiles.

INTERPRETATIONS AND CONCLUSIONS




Figure 18. Approximate location of Lathrop House and 2010 excavation units compared to 1715.




Figure 19. Approximate location of Lathrop House and 2010 excavation units compared to 1800.




Figure 20. Approximate location of Lathrop House and 2010 excavation units compared to 1834.

As part of the process of artifact interpretation, IAC overlaid the 2010 location of Lathrop House and excavation units on top of schematic representations of historic landscapes (Figures 18, 19, 20). These three successive figures portray the complexity of the land-use history for the urban landholding, with the coming and going of gardens, cow sheds and barns, and multiple privies. Each of these features result in a change in the topography and nature of deposits later encountered by archaeologists. These three figures are also compared against the ownership (Table 2) and occupation history (Table 3) at the Paul Revere Memorial Association.

In the 1600s, the north and east excavation units fall in the back garden, while the south EU lies relatively within the "Site of stable for cow and horse," dated 1664 (see Figure 18). Two privies are shown at the back of each of the lots attributed to John Barnard (housewright) and Robert Howard (merchant). The merchant, Howard, had ample opportunity and finances to import the best in English and German ceramics, found at the site in Westerwald and Rhenish stonewares, English white salt-glazed stoneware and buff-colored coarse earthenware. Remnants of these wares, along with broken bottle glass, and refuse from food production (bones, shell) were likely thrown out in the backyard and incorporated in the garden.

In 1800, the south EU is still in the vicinity of the 1776 "cow house," while the east and north excavation units fall within the large area designated as "garden." Beginning in 1741, when the widow Howard sold the property, occupation in the second half of the 1700s was taken up with a variety of mariners and tradesmen, of whom one is the silversmith, Paul Revere. Paul Revere acquired the property at 19 North Square in 1770, he rented out the house between 1780 and 1790 or so, and then resided in the house until 1800. While the social status of the various occupants would never achieve the height of the merchant Howard, these occupants (Knox, Revere, Defrance, and Dunkerly) are likely to have had sufficient personal wealth to purchase the English white salt-glazed stoneware, buff-colored-coarse earthenware, tin-enameled wares found in the south and east EUs.

In the first quarter of the nineteenth century (see Figure 20), the landscape of the property is complex, with a stable, 3-story brick building, a barn, and at least two privies. The north and east excavation units are both relatively near the privies, while the south EU is near the barn. During this time period, occupants on the property were tenants, rather than owners, and we can speculate that their social status and income levels may have been lower than owners in earlier households. Perhaps not coincidentally, the artifacts in shortest supply in the 2010 investigation were those painted and printed pearlwares and whitewares.

Of the three units, the east EU (N202.3 E207.5) had the most complex – but best preserved – archaeological deposits. We recommend additional controlled excavation in this room, especially since the basal levels of the cellar foundation were not reached.

We do not recommend any further *archaeological* excavation in the immediate vicinity of the south EU (N200 E200), because it appears that these deposits are well mixed, containing artifacts spanning the 1700s through the end of the 1900s. However, we recommend that the floor grade is lowered through hand excavation, and that soils are screened for artifacts. Perhaps the screening can be completed with a corps of volunteers, supervised by a professional archaeologist, who could monitor for changes in stratification and who could identify possible features.




Figure 21. View of IAC excavation units compared to 1983 BU units. Note the proximity of drainage feature, cobblestone pavement, and 19th-century privy encountered by BU immediately to the exterior of the North Unit beneath the wooden deck of Lathrop House.

In the north EU (N208.3 E208.1), IAC encountered a brick feature. It appears to be similar to the brick feature uncovered by Boston University in their 1983 investigation, but it is aligned perpendicular to the brick feature (L. 22) uncovered by IAC in 2010 (Figure 21). We recommend further archaeological investigation beneath the porch to discern how Locus 22 is related – if at all – to the brick-and-stone drainage feature of BU's Unit F.

Boston University conducted analysis of the privy contents and found two distinct deposits. The upper layers contained artifacts that put the date of the fill sometime after the 1890s. The lower privy layers, however, appeared to date to the 1870s. Given the dates of these deposits, it is likely that the privy in Unit E was built up against the exterior wall of the Lathrop House. However, it is possible that the privy *pre-dated* the construction of the Lathrop House with a portion of it continuing beneath the wooden deck of the Lathrop House. BU found many early artifacts at relatively shallow depths beneath the 1983 ground surface, and these yard deposits probably extend beneath the deck. Archaeologists may find the western continuation of a cobblestone pavement exposed in 1983.




Figure 22. Proposed additional archaeological investigation for the Lathrop House at the Paul Revere Memorial Association.

It is difficult to make generalizations about other parts of the basement, where no sampling took place. Minimally, we recommend testing in two additional areas, as shown in Figure 22 to see confirm whether deposits are disturbed or intact.

As part of ongoing archaeological research for the Paul Revere Memorial Association (PRMA), we offer the following notations:

- We were unable to fully incorporate the 2010 results with those of earlier archaeological survey at the site by Boston University. We compiled a site plan, showing the location of archaeological units and features from both 1983 and 2010 (see Figure 3). This archaeological plan should be compared against historic reconstructions of land-use behind the Paul Revere and Peirce-Hichborn houses, so that archaeologists can predict where buried features may be present. This research may be completed by a research intern or volunteers.
- As part of the compilation of archaeological findings, it may be helpful to interview Dr. Ricardo Elia and Dr. Mary Beaudry, to reconstruct details of the project that may not have been represented in the report.
- It might also be helpful to combine the artifact catalogs into a single Excel spread sheet or Access database. These would include the artifacts from the 1983 Boston University excavation, the artifacts collected by City Archaeologist Ellen Berkland, and those recovered by IAC in July 2010.
- For continued excavation, we recommend opening the east EU (N202.3 E207.5) by at least double, so that archaeologists have more space to excavate to deeper levels. If the unit is expanded to the west, archaeologists can explore what appears to be a barrel privy (L. 21), wrapped in glacial clay (L. 3). It would be most advantageous to excavate both to the north and to the west, so that the basal walls of the foundation can be reached and to provide archaeologists with sufficient room to excavate and expose deeply buried stratified deposits and features. This unit contained many materials dating from the 1600s and 1700s from the most intact contexts at the site with further analysis, some of these materials may be attributed to individual households.
- In the area beneath the deck at the northeast end of Lathrop House, we propose additional excavation to expose more of Locus 22 in its length and depth. We recommend also that the excavation area be extended across the width of the deck, as shown in Figure 22.
- In the untested part of the basement, we recommend the hand excavation of two (2) excavation units, each measuring 1.3 m² (4 ft²) to confirm the nature of deposits beneath the concrete floor. These units should be excavated the northwest and northeast rooms, as depicted in Figure 22.
- Archaeologists have collected an extensive artifact assemblage from the two formal investigations as well as the artifact retrieved by Ellen Berkland. As these materials are managed as a single collection, we recommend that PRMA begin to think about various kinds of analysis that researchers can undertake. One level of analysis is to determine the minimum vessel count (MVC) for ceramics and glass, to learn more about the vessel forms and possible functions. This MVC quantification can be completed by archaeological interns or volunteers. Analyses of other artifact classes are the species identification of bone and shell, to learn more about the foodways of site inhabitants.
- Finally, the renovation of the Lathrop House is a major undertaking that will result in the removal of more than 80 square meters (860 square feet) of basement deposits. The 2010 excavation demonstrated that the buried soil horizons contain artifacts from the 1600s

through the 1830s. Some deposits are very rich in artifacts, with many ceramic sherds, mammal bone, and bottle glass. This household refuse *may be* attributable to the various occupants of the Paul Revere House. As such, PRMA may wish to see that all of the basement dirt is screened prior to its removal off site. The screening exercise can be organized as a project for children from local schools or for adult volunteers.
