Docket #1145, message and order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend an amount not to exceed Four Hundred Thousand Dollars (\$400,000.00), from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EOEEA) Division of Conservation Services Parkland Acquisitions and Renovations for Communities (PARC) Program, awarded to the City of Boston, through the Parks and Recreation Department, for renovations to Winthrop Playground, located in the neighborhood of Dorchester.

Docket #1146, message and order authorizing the City of Boston to accept and expend an amount not to exceed Three Hundred Eighty Seven Thousand One Hundred Sixty Four Dollars (\$387,164.00), from the Commonwealth of Massachusetts Executive Office of Energy and Environmental Affairs (EOEEA) Division of Conservation Services Parkland Acquisitions and Renovations for Communities (PARC) Program, awarded to the City of Boston, through the Parks and Recreation Department, to help fund the acquisition of two parcels on the western shore of Sprague Pond at 0-4 Lakeside Avenue in Hyde Park, as a permanently protected parkland to be known as the Sprague Pond Shoreline Reserve.

These matters were sponsored by the Administration, and were referred to the Committee on November 3, 2021.
