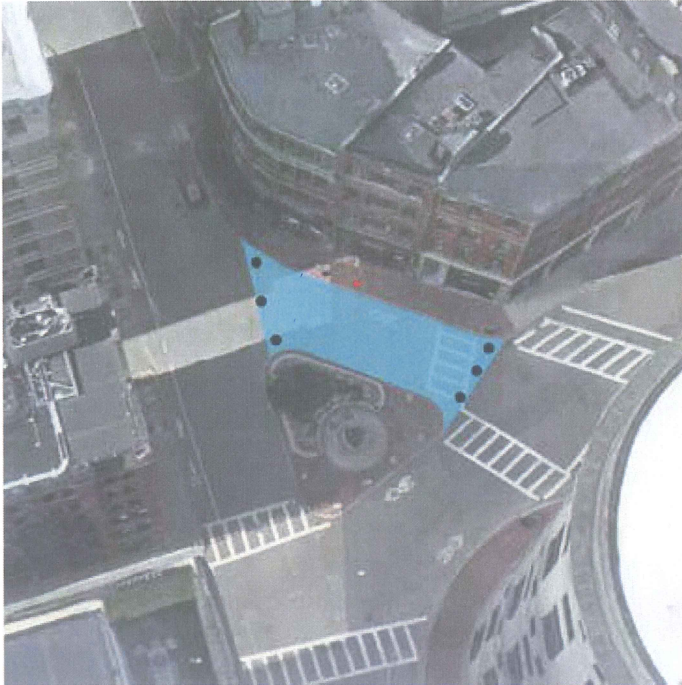


LIBERTY SQUARE PEDESTRIAN PLAZA

BACKGROUND

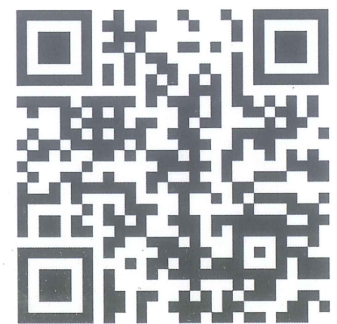
Liberty Square is located in Downtown Boston and is home to the Hungarian Revolution Memorial Statue. In 2019, Boston's Mayor's Office of New Urban Mechanics ran a one-day pilot activating this site. This included closing the street, adding seating, games, and other placemaking efforts.

ISSUES TO CONSIDER

When not closed to traffic, this space is primarily used as a slip lane and an unofficial loading zone. On weekdays at lunchtime, the area is populated with office workers eating lunch from nearby establishments, often sitting on the raised beds surrounding the statue. We see this as a need for a more lively pedestrian area, one that allows people to enjoy their meals and socialize outdoors.

NEXT STEPS

The Boston Transportation Department is speaking with people in the square about this project and creating designs to share with the community. We hope to create a pedestrian plaza that will connect community members to the square. Reach out to us with questions, concerns, or support!
