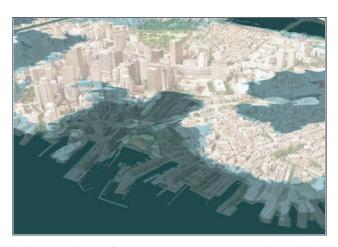
Be PREPARED for a FLOOD

Floods are the most frequent type of natural disaster. Learn how to protect yourself, your loved ones, and your property.



Did you know...

1 inch of floodwater can lead to \$25,000 in damage*

Over 50% of flood deaths are auto related, usually from drivers misjudging the depth of water. **Turn around; don't drown!**‡



BEFORE A FLOOD

- ☐ Indoors: Elevate valuables, flood-proof basements with sandbags, and move mechanical equipment above the floodplain.
- Outdoors: Declutter gutters and drains and tie-down outdoor furniture.
- Know how to shut off your utilities.
- Consider **flood insurance**. Visit www.fema.gov/flood-insurance.
- Know your evacuation zone. Visit Boston.gov/emergency.

DURING A FLOOD

- Monitor the forecast and emergency alerts.
- Unplug appliances to prevent electrical shock when power comes back on.
- Report non-emergency issues to 3-1-1.
- Check on your neighbors!
- Find an emergency shelter at **boston.gov/emergency**

Take pictures of damage for documentation.



Protect yourself with gloves & boots.



Throw away damaged items.



Kill germs and mold: One cup bleach + One gallon water



Use fans and dehumidifiers for drying.

AFTER A FLOOD

Flooding is the only natural hazard for which the Federal government provides insurance!

- Check if a disaster has been declared for Suffolk County and apply for FEMA Individual Assistance at fema.gov/assistance/individual
- Apply for a disaster loan through the Small Business Association at lending.sba.gov/search-disaster
