Therefore, we anticipate the vendor will implement a multi-layered approach to protect PII, which includes encryption, access controls, data masking, and regular security assessments. We also expect policies for data usage and retention to be clear and unambiguous for all personnel working on this project including subawardees, with regular training and a robust incident response plan in place. |
