He also briefly explained how to participate in the online hearing. There were no members of the press present.




25.0557 SB 10-12 CUMBERLAND STREET, BOSTON, MA - Repoint apex parapet wall in-kind.

25.0685 BLC - 310 WASHINGTON ST - Includes repair of existing building enclosure components to address recurring water leakage into the basement level of the Old South Meeting House at the south side of the building along Milk Street.

23.0226 BLC BOSTON CITY HALL, 1 CITY HALL SQUARE, BOSTON, MA-

Extend approval of HVAC system upgrades at roof that includes installation of air handling units and exposed trunk ductwork to January 26, 2026.

25.0580 BSR 17 BAY STATE ROAD, BOSTON, MA - At front facade, replace basement window in-kind.





25.0691 BLC 12 SOUTH STREET - Historically appropriate wall covering and paint will be applied in the Southeast Hall and adjacent bathroom.

25.0530 AB 1871-1875 COMMONWEALTH AVENUE, BOSTON, MA - On the Chestnut Hill Elevation; remove deteriorated sealant at water table over bay window at unit 5 and recaulk. Repair to original condition. East elevation-Repoint deteriorated masonry area under the chimney. Restore to original condition.

The goal of this work is to enhance the second-floor public transaction area while ensuring accessible counters available for all constituents.
