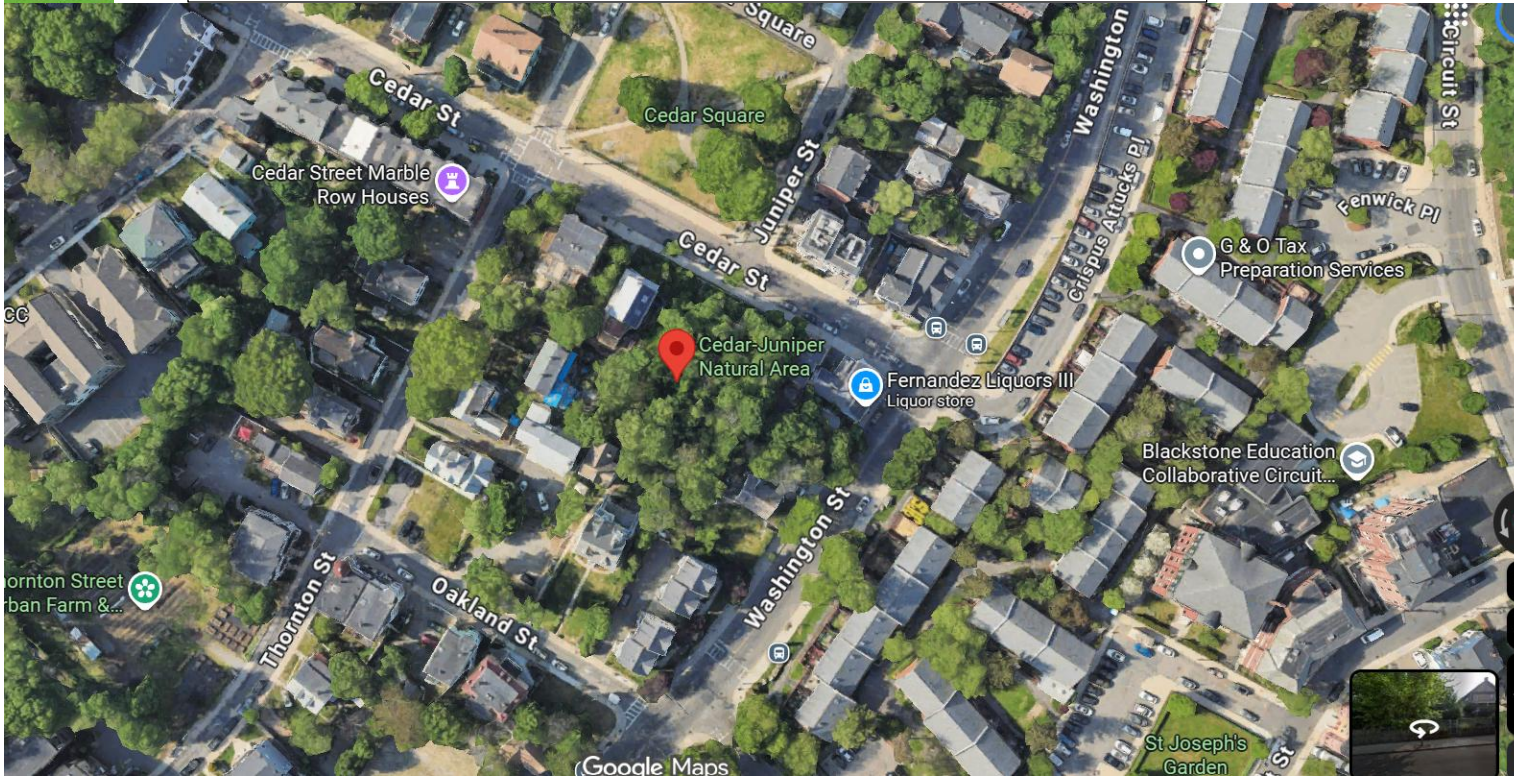




Cedar Street Community Garden 6 Cedar Street



Project Goals:

- Create (36) community garden plots utilizing raised planters with high-quality planting soil. Create a useable landscape that provides food growing plots, fruit trees, gathering space and ornamental plantings. The finished garden should function as community space that is both useable and enjoyable.
- Complete site work activities that disturb the least amount of soil to create a useable grade for garden installation. Minimize imported material to the greatest extent possible
- Preserve the maximum amount of existing tree cover and retain puddingstone cultural resource features.
- Preserve the urban wild section of the property by preserving existing tree cover and planting native trees to replace trees removed. Create a simple pathway for exploration by visitors.
