**AN ORDER AUTHORIZING THE CITY OF BOSTON TO ACCEPT AND EXPEND** Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) FUNDS, AWARDED BY Corporation for National and Community Service.

**WHEREAS**, the Corporation for National and Community Service, is being petitioned for the issuance of funds to the Elderly Commission; and

**WHEREAS**, the funds in the amount of ONE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE DOLLARS (**\$130,253.00**) would fund 356 RSVP volunteers who will provide social support to homebound or older adults and individuals with disabilities. Therefore be it

**ORDERED**: that the Mayor, acting on behalf of the City of Boston be, and hereby is authorized, pursuant to section 53A of chapter 44 of the Massachusetts General Laws, to accept and expend the Corporation for National and Community Service, Retired Senior Volunteer Program (RSVP) award not to exceed the amount of ONE HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND TWO HUNDRED FIFTY-THREE DOLLARS (**\$130,253.00**).
